I'm sure they would much rather have the State of Nebraska accept title to this waste and the land because then we have the liability with the title. Now that's not the right thing to do. I'm sorry. If you notice today the compact commission had another phone conference to discuss business. The Governor requested they delay that and they did not delay it. Again, the compact states are not listening to the people in Nebraska. They had the phone conference against our Governor's will. He didn't want to have a phone conference, he didn't want to have it today in particular and they wouldn't even delay it one day. Folks, it's business as usual, business as usual and that's not right. I'm sorry to bring it up at this point but we're talking money all day long today and we're talking big money now. We cannot allow the generators from outside of this state to control the destiny of our state through their control of this compact process. We ask them a simple favor, delay your meeting one day so our Governor isn't busy with veto overrides and budget considerations and last minute preparations for the speech he's going to give us here in a little bit; they wouldn't even do that. And now because they, out-of-state generators requesting we hold this bill over that takes the liability away from the State of Nebraska, we're going to bow down to them one more time and say, sure, whatever you need, folks. I don't want to take a lot of time on this. I'd ask you to support my motion and let's read this bill. It's only six pages long. Let's vote on it and move on. Thank you.
