

Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have ceased debate. Do you have closing, Senator Morrissey?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: I do, thank you. Again, this might not seem appropriate but I think it's very appropriate, very appropriate at this time and place. Conference call this morning, the agenda of which was published this morning, we've asked them not to do that anymore because of the secrecy that seems to have surrounded this subject and the problems they have had because of the way they have conducted their business. The agenda was published this morning. The Governor objected to that, asked for a delay, they wouldn't give the delay, the conference was this morning. If you want to continue to let them dictate to us, that's fine. I don't think so. I don't think that's the way to do it. The generators, as Senator Owen stated, the generators, the outstate generators are asking us to hold this bill off because they think we should take title to the land and the waste. I don't respond to the wishes of the outstate generators. We're here to represent the people of Nebraska, not the moneymaking generators from other states in this compact. Six-page bill, I'd ask you to take two quick votes, override, I need 30, read it, 25 to pass, it's the thing to do. We've discussed it. It has moved through the session real easily and all of a sudden people from another area, another state asked us to hold on and we respond business as normal the way this compact has gone for the...since we've been involved and the very reason that we have gotten into the trouble we're in now. I'd ask you to support my motion. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Morrissey. We will now vote on the motion to overrule the agenda. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Request for a record vote. Please record, Mr. Clerk.
