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clarification in my mind. That means if the...if the budget would come in too high in the minds of the county board, they would have the prerequisite to...to reduce the budget or discuss it and so forth, apply pressure?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Definitely.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: They are the final ruling...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: They are the final ruling.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...even though...even though their levy might be outside of the county levy limitation.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, in fact I thought they were right now. In our local county, one year we came in...we wanted \$5,000 more and they said only take \$3,000. So we only took \$3,000, because I thought they were...that they had to approve of now. I was surprised that they didn't have to. Every year, I always send my budget for local county fair to the county commissioners for their approval. I thought you had to do that. So we're just making everybody do that now.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I...maybe I'm not thinking clearly on this, but I...what would happen if they'd come in on their allowable levy limit at which it'd be, but it's more than the county board would want them to spend. Which would reign here?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: The county board reigns.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: The county board has to...shall be approved. It doesn't say it may be, it said it shall be approved.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So this, in effect, will amount to another limit beyo...other than the levy limit that we might have now.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Right, yes, yeah.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Kristensen.
