

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, or Madam President, excuse me, Senator Coordsen, I now have your amendment to the committee amendments, Senator, on page 156 of the Journal. (See Senator Coordsen's AM2346.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: This is the amendment that changes the date. The bill was introduced a year ago and it is necessary to adopt this amendment to the Standing Committee amendments to move the date, the effective date of the bill, from 1992 to 1993, so I would encourage the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Does anyone wish to speak to the amendment to the amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Coordsen? Closing is waived. We'll now vote on the amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Coordsen's amendment to the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment to the amendments is adopted. We will now recognize senators wishing to speak to the committee amendments. Does anyone wish to speak to the committee amendments? Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President and members. Senator Coordsen, if you would respond to a question, just so I understand what the purpose of the committee amendments are. George, it was my understanding that the committee amendments are those that are found in front of the bill, that it's basically the paragraph "C". Is that correct?

SENATOR COORDSEN: That's right.

SENATOR HALL: And was your argument in favor or in opposition to the committee amendments?
