CLERK:    Senator Hillman voting yes.

SPEAKER BAACK:    We are looking for Senators Ashford and Lynch.

CLERK:    Senator Hartnett voting yes.

SPEAKER BAACK:    Senator Hall, would you check in, please.

CLERK:    Senator Lamb voting no.

SPEAKER BAACK:    We're looking for Senator Rod Johnson.

CLERK:    Senator Peterson voting yes.

SPEAKER BAACK:    Senator Schimek, would you check in, please. We are looking for Senators Rod Johnson and Ashford. Senator Haberman, did you wish to request a roll call vote?

SENATOR HABERMAN:    Yes, I do.

SPEAKER BAACK:    We are now looking for Senator Ashford. Senator Rod Johnson, would you check in, please. We will proceed, and Senator Kristensen has requested a reverse order. Mr. Clerk, proceed with the roll.

CLERK:    (Roll call vote taken. See pages 200-01 of the Legislative Journal.) 24 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK:    The amendment fails. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK:    I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK:    Senator Wesely, I believe you have opened already on the bill. Is there anyone else who wishes to discuss LB 424? We're on the advancement of LB 424. The call is raised. Seeing no further discussion, Senator Wesely, did you wish to close?

SENATOR WESELY:    Yes, very briefly. This deals with the question of paid petition circulators. A court decision several years ago required us to allow that practice. Concern about it has led to the idea of at least informing the public about the fact that a circulator of petitions is a paid circulator and not
