And we would like to have that available. So the direction isn't to open up, it is to tighten up the system and I really think that those of you who are concerned about this will want to support the amendment. So I would ask your support for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard Senator Wesely's closing on the amendment to the committee amendments. We will now vote on that amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.
