PRESIDENT MOUL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT MOUL: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen, and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our chaplain this morning is Major Robert Aldrich of the Salvation Army in Lincoln. Major Aldrich.

MAJOR ALDRICH: (Prayer offered.)
