

January 13, 1992 LB 861, 862

January 8, referred directly to General File, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, LB 861 has the same purpose as LB 858 except that it affects Volume 6, and again this would substitute the reference to the Uniform Commercial Code for the terms of this act and it was for the same reason related to the computer use as 858. I move the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Is there anyone who wishes to speak to this bill? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 861. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 861.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 861 is advanced. LB 862.

CLERK: 862, Madam President, introduced by Senator Warner. (Title read.) The bill was introduced on January 8, referred directly to General File, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, LB 862 deals with Sections 81-2501, 81-2507, both of which contain provisions of what constitutes a quorum for the Commission of Indian Affairs. The bill would combine the language so it would only appear in one section. The director of the commission has reviewed the bill and says that it looks okay. I move the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Is there anyone who wishes to speak to this bill? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 862. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 862.
