

January 13, 1992 LB 870, 871

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, LB 870 again is a bill that will correct... substitute a correct reference within the statutes. The legislation was acted in 1959 amending these statutes with this, refers to an annual reports that were required and this makes the reference relative to that annual report in the correct section as a result of the enactment of the bill in 1959. I move the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Is there anyone who wishes to speak to this bill? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 870. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 870.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 870 is advanced. LB 871.

CLERK: 871 introduced by Senator Warner as chairperson of the Executive Board. (Title read.) The bill was introduced on January 8, referred directly to General File, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, LB 871 divides Sections 77-2702 and 77-2704 to many smaller sections. These sections, one deals with sales and use tax provisions. The other deals with exemptions from the Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967. Both of these sections are quite lengthy and by dividing them into smaller... or into a number of sections rather than just two, it will significantly reduce the length of bills that are proposed as amendments to these provisions as the handout indicates. A bill for even the smallest amendment in 77-2702 would often be 32 pages long. This was a... this bill reflects some requests. The directive that was made to the revisor over numerous times in the past and it obviously will reduce cost of the introduction of bills because of the cost per page for printing with many times unnecessary language in order to review some proposed legislation. I move this bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Does anyone wish to speak to this bill? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 871. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed
