CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Committee amendments are adopted. Senator Schellpeper, do you have opening on the bill itself?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Madam Chairman and members. As I said before, the bill now has been changed from what I introduced the bill. But I think it is, it will help them in their election so I guess it isn't totally destroyed. But I think that Senator Hartnett is right. They need to come back and take a look at something that we can do to help the SIDs. We have several of them in Nebraska. I have some in Stanton County and I think we need to try to do what we can to make them a little more helpful to the people that live in the SIDs. And with that I would just move the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Does anyone else wish to speak to the bill itself? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 764. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 2 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 764.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 764 is advanced. LB 312.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 312 is a bill introduced by Senator Schmit. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 16 of 1991, referred to the Agriculture Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Agriculture Committee.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Rogers.

SENATOR ROGERS: Madam President, LB 312 was introduced by Senator Schmit with the intention of preventing individuals from interfering with the normal operations of research facilities in livestock operations. I think you're probably all aware of the last few years there has been some difficulty, especially in some research senators, or centers. The bill also establishes
