

CLERK: Okay.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We do have amendments to the committee amendments. Is there anyone who wishes to speak to these? Senator Schmit, do you want to speak to the, okay. Senator Dierks. Senator Rogers, would you like to close on the amendments to the committee amendments?

SENATOR ROGERS: No, I'll waive closing.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We will now vote on the amendments to the committee amendments. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Rogers' amendments to the amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendments to the committee amendments are adopted. Now recognize those wishing to speak to the committee amendments. Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Rogers?

SENATOR ROGERS: No, waive closing.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Closing is waived. We will now vote on the motion to adopt the committee amendments. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Committee amendments are adopted. Senator Schmit, would you like to open on the bill?
