SENATOR NELSON: Right.

SENATOR LYNCH: ...new District 21 and minus the District number 33. And, as you can see, over on District 3 then you have plus the District 33 and then minus District 21 and 39, and then, as you can see, under the second district there is a plus of District 39 which is the urban-suburban district between Omaha and Lincoln, as I understand it. So, basically, the three was designed after the process now used for the selection to the Executive Committee caucus.

SENATOR NELSON: Thank you. I had picked that up from my office, that you passed out earlier, and I still had a little bit of a problem with it, but thanks for that explanation. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Nelson. Anyone else wishing to discuss the amendment by Senator Hartnett? Seeing no one, Senator Hartnett, did you wish to close?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I think if you look at the...at the sheet that I passed out, and I think this six process here, we have it in the District 1 and District 2, basically make up the second Congressional district, 3 and 5 make up the District number 1, a Congressional district, and 4 and 6 simply make up the other...the 3rd Congressional district. And I think that...you know, I think the most...what I think it does is it gives it balance as we're changing in the state, moving more to the eastern part of the state, and I think it simply gives a common answer. So I would simply ask the body to support this amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard Senator Hartnett's closing. We will now vote on the amendment offered by Senator Hartnett. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no.
