The 15 commission members, chaired by Lieutenant Governor Moul, have already accomplished much as I'm sure you can see by an examination of the report. The report has been kept brief deliberately, Senator Bernard-Stevens indicating earlier that he didn't think that he was going to read it because it was too short. It has been kept short deliberately so that you will read it. I hope that you do read it and have some sense of the accomplishments of the commission to date. There is a vast amount of information that is available to you if you will request it from the commission on those areas in which you may have a specific interest and as addressed in the report. And I hope that you have that interest as we continue to work toward the goal of rural development. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. We will now return to debate on the Chambers amendment to LB 327 and the speaking order at the time we left debate was Senator Chambers, Nelson, Crosby and Labeledz. Senator Chambers.
