SENATOR CROSBY: No, I'm hoping they will all go.

SENATOR PIRSCH: They'll all go and be amended all together with all of the list.

SENATOR CROSBY: Um-hum.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay, thank you. With that in mind, I guess maybe we should wait to see if any amendment makes the acceptance by the body and then decide if we want to ask or to add volunteers and clergy. So, for that reason, I guess I'll be opposing this amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Pirsch. Does anyone else wish to speak to the Bohlke amendment? Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Madam Speaker, Madam President, I have no objections to this amendment to the amendment. I think that the amendment itself is expensive enough, we just as well add some more to it, so I don't object to this amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Dierks. Does anyone else wish to speak to the amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Bohlke? Senator Bohlke, do you have closing? Closing is waived. We'll now vote on the Bohlke amendment to the Crosby amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the Bohlke amendment? Have you all voted? Have you all voted on the Bohlke amendment to the Crosby amendments? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 7 nays on the amendment to the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment to the amendment is adopted. We will return to debate on the Crosby amendment. The speaking order is Senators Nelson, Crosby, Hall, Schimek, Horgan and Beutler. Senator Nelson.

SENATOR NELSON: Maybe I better take my opportunity while I can. I don't necessarily speak to Senator Crosby's amendment. But I have a question for Senator Dierks or maybe Senator Stevens if he is here. I know Senator Stevens mentioned that it could take four weeks, six weeks or seven weeks for this background check and what went around in my mind is how come on the gun control we could figure it out in a minute or two minutes or three
