allow some reporting requirements and we think we can impose a tax on it.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Pirsch. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I'll speak to the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you. Does anyone else wish to speak to the Will amendment? Seeing none, I'll recognize Senator Will for closing.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. Again, as often happens, a substantial amount of debate occurred on the bill during the...what actually was the debate on the...my amendment. My amendment...my amendment simply would change the operative date of the act from October 31, 1991 to January 1, 1993, so we make sure that we are not doing anything retroactively, that we are doing this only prospectively. I would urge your support of my amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Will. We will now vote on the Will amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Will's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill at this time, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We will then go back to debate on the bill itself. Senator Robinson, followed by Senators Horgan, Wehrbein, Schimek, Lindsay, Byars and Schmit. Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Madam President, members of the body, I look at this bill and I think these ought to be lids. I don't think we ought to be able to spend any more money than this. What do we do when we get contributions? Someone's paying for it out there. Whether it's the lobby or what it is, they're laying it back on people that make money for them. I think 50,000 bucks is plenty...we ought to limit it to 50,000 bucks and three pairs
