It's a media bashing campaign in the city. Isn't it, Eric. I can tell...I can tell by the smile on his face. We spend too much money. We spend too much money. We ought to limit it. This ought to...these ought to be limits. I...I can't believe we're...we're coming out and we're going to impose an income tax on people. We ought to have a strict limit. That's...that's what we should do. My goodness, I can't believe this. My old conservative friend up there, Senator Chizek, he would...I tell you, he could stand a little walking. I'm...I'll even walk with you...I'll even walk with you, Jerry, because it would do us both good. I can't believe, though, that we're...we're talking about imposing an income tax on...what we ought to do is limit it. And I know my friend, Senator Schmit, would agree with me. We ought to limit that. Government's too big, people. Go up to the coffee shops. Ask them. We get down here...we get in this vacuum here and we talk here. Go back there and talk to those people out in the hinterlands and see what they say. You ought to...oh, yes you've got hinterlands in Omaha. I know where they are. 'Nuff said.
