SENATOR LINDSAY: In Nebraska, I don't believe there is one.

SENATOR ROBINSON: There isn't any, huh?

SENATOR LINDSAY: At the federal level, it's either a thousand or five thousand.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Maybe we ought to attack it that way, huh? What do you think about that?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Well, that's certainly a possibility too, yeah. As far as...there are other proposals out there. In Government Committee now, there are a couple of proposals sitting in committee right now to have other financing reforms. This is not intended as a cure-all.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Intended as a good start.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah, maybe that's the way. I wanted to let you know, too, Senator Lindsay, that I have sold my two pair of shoes just in case that, you know, in three years that something comes over me that, you know, I get violently ill or something, I happen to go down to the Secretary of State, that I can use those shoes. I did want to let you know that, that I got a couple other things here.
