appraised value. That's what I meant to be done and I certainly support this amendment to my amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lamb.

SENATOR WITHEM: Again, just a brief one sentence or two closing here, that is what the amendment does. It places an item in the bill that was inadvertently omitted from the drafting of the bill and also Senator Lamb is doing some confession. The committee should have taken care of this also and we inadvertently didn't and just happened to catch it this morning. So what it does is it sets a floor saying you can't sell the land for anything less than appraised value and I think if the Legislature is going to adopt this policy that that ought to be there as a minimum.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Withem. We'll now vote on the Withem amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Withem's amendment to Senator Lamb's amendment.
