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university to cut four million dollars, we are asking cuts here and yet we merrily go on our way. We don't have the fortitude to sometimes bite the bullet.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Nelson. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: I rise only to report what I heard about the academy last year, and that was somewhat negative, that there was not sufficient supervision, particularly at night, and that the whole program could be improved. I will probably vote for Senator Hefner's amendment, but I think we do need to take a close look at the administration of the program.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lamb. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President. I rise in support of Senator Hefner's amendment, I think. Senator Hefner, would you respond to a question?

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Certainly.

SENATOR HALL: Elroy, how much is this amendment for?

SENATOR HEFNER: How much money?

SENATOR HALL: Yeah. Yes.

SENATOR HEFNER: I would say...

SENATOR HALL: Based on the discussion, I thought I read 27,000 in the amendment, is that correct?

SENATOR HEFNER: That was last year's cost.

SENATOR HALL: But then the amendment would, basically, continue that same similar appropriation?

SENATOR HEFNER: In the approximate range. I think this last year we ended up with about \$30,000 in our budget.

SENATOR HALL: Okay.

SENATOR HEFNER: In an appropriation bill.
