CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 706 advances. I might announce that this will be the last bill that we'll do today but those remaining few bills on consent calendar will be first up tomorrow morning so we will get to those bills. So we're not going to pass over them completely but I think if we go much past the noon hour we will run into committee problems, so...but those bills will be up again in the morning. LB 706A.

CLERK: 706A by Senator Ashford. (Title read.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Ashford.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Thank you, Mr. President. Again, this is the Historic Preservation Task Force. There is a \$5,000 per year A bill which I believe has gone down slightly because we've decreased the number of members so it would be about \$7,500. In any event, I would move its advancement at this point.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any discussion on the advancement of LB 706A? Seeing none, we will vote on the advancement. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Voting on the advancement of LB 706A. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 706A.
