

SENATOR ELMER: The same.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: So possibly this...this fiscal note for developing the rules and regs, that looks like one person for a whole year. Maybe they could just look and see if the other rules and regs might...

SENATOR ELMER: I would assume so too, Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: ...(inaudible) copy machine type at 10 cents for the copy and...

SENATOR ELMER: I don't think this bill would be damaged at all to pass the bill and defeat the A bill.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you. I'm supporting Senator Elmer's bill. The one thing, folks, I said it before and I'm...I'll say it again, there is more to mandates than Medicaid. We have other mandates coming down. Now I suppose if all the people that were served by Medicaid were laying out in the country, back in the woods, back in the trees, down in a ditch, and we didn't see them, we wouldn't worry about them as much as we do about all the other...all the landfills and other things that are going to hit us, costs that are going to hit us in the near future here. Another mandate, only we have 22 months instead of a year or less than a year to address it. So we need to...Senator Robinson is right, we need to discuss budget issues and where the money is going to come from because this, quite obviously, this was on nobody's priority list. Any of this was on nobody's priority list. We don't want to pay for solid waste on the state level and we don't want to give the local authorities the ability to pay for it. We don't want to give them the ability. We're going to tell them to do it and that we're not going to let them know how they can pay for it. No taxing authority, no state money, just do it, folks, just do it. Cut all these millions of dollars out of your budget that you're wasting on roads and bridges and schools and hospitals and do your landfill and solid waste management stuff with that money. So we have to start prioritizing. Senator Robinson is right, and we have to figure out where the money is going to come from. But let's not just talk about Medicaid, let's talk about everything that we're facing here and let's make the tough decisions and let's start prioritizing. The importance of this bill is that if you want those recycling centers to have the ability to recycle, for one thing, they have to have a labeling
