on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Schmit's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Senator Will.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move the advancement of LB 718A to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 718A. All those in favor vote aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. We will now proceed to LB 312.

CLERK: Mr. President, 312, I have E & R pending, first of all, Senator.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 312.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 312. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Beutler would move to amend the bill. (Beutler amendment, AM2414 appears on page 506 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this is the bill that has to do with research on animals and interfering with research on animals. You may recall, on General File, it was generally agreed that we would strike the provision with the criminal penalty and rely upon the criminal mischief statute, which, in some cases, would have a better or more severe penalty in the case of interference. And so that's all this amendment does. It just strikes Sections 2 and 3,
