PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schrock. We will now vote on the motion to advance LB 948. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 948.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 948 is advanced. I would like to call the senators' attention to the area under the south balcony. Special guests today of Senator Robinson are Richard Commealy, Don Bartling and Vince Krampert. Would you please rise and be recognized. Welcome to the Chambers. Thank you. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Very quickly, Madam President, thank you. Senator Conway gives notice of hearing by the Government Committee, Senator Chizek, notice of hearing by Judiciary Committee. That's all that I have.

PRESIDENT MOUL. Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We will proceed with LB 130.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 130 was a bill introduced by Senators Schimek, Nelson, Dierks and Peterson. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10 of 1991. At that time, it was referred to the Judiciary Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Judiciary Committee.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Is there someone from the Judiciary Committee who is going to handle those amendments? Senator Wickersham. Thank you.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Madam President. I'm sorry for being inattentive. The original language of LB 130 prohibited all sales...and I want to emphasize all sales of tobacco products through vending machines. The penalty in the original bill was a Class III misdemeanor, plus suspension or revocation of any offenders licensed to sell tobacco in any subsequent
