SENATOR ROBAK: I just wondered if this portion of the amendment had anything to do with cigarette machines...vending machines in workplaces, in break rooms? No. Does any portion of the bill? Your amendment.

SENATOR MOORE: Well, you know, what we're discussing now is simply the date change. The first part of the amendment doesn't directly affect workplace and I believe the committee amendment addresses workplaces. This amendment just simply is the date change, we're talking about now.

SENATOR ROBAK: Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Robak. There is no one else wishing to speak to this portion of the amendment. Do you have closing?

SENATOR MOORE: Move for the adoption of Section 2.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Moore. We will now vote on the Moore amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of...which is essentially Section 2 of AM2551.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment to the amendment is adopted and we'll now proceed with debate on Section 1 of the amendments. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Moore a question. Senator Moore, I don't know much about what is allowed under liquor licenses, that's why I have to ask you this question. Under your amendment, would liquor be salable at restaurants? In other words, are there restaurants with liquor licenses where you can consume it on the premises and children can patronize or people who are minors can patronize those establishments?

SENATOR MOORE: Under the amendment, as written, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So this would still make the vending machines available to minors if it's in a restaurant?
