possibly amend your amendment to make it satisfactory to everybody. And I don't find what I'm looking for right now. But what would you say to the suggestion that we try to discuss this and come back on Select File, maybe, with an agreed upon amendment.

SENATOR MOORE: Obviously, the bill in its present form I would oppose advancement of, Senator Schimek. I mean I would like to work...I mean I would like to work with you, but I'd just as soon work with the knowledge the body is willing to broaden it to places with liquor licenses. So I mean at this point in time I would not be willing to support advancement without some sort of amendment broadening it to include establishments with liquor licenses.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, let me ask you one more question, Senator Moore. The second suggestion I have is that we would add on to line 4, after the period, any cigarette vending machine on such premises shall be within five feet of the main cash register. Would you have a problem with that?

SENATOR MOORE: Well, I agree...I don't know, I can't answer that one without thinking about how actually that will...within five feet of the cash register.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well I'm not picky about the number of feet. But you get the idea that the vending machines isn't,...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...as you suggested, out in some dark hallway or corner where kids can just go in and buy at will.

SENATOR MOORE: Well, the one thought on that vein is that some people have...inserting in line 2, instead of saying, any establishment, within the licensed premises. So, arguably, you may...the hallways out in front aren't necessarily the licensed premises. And so you would get them out of the hallways. I don't...that language I could...I would support, I think it would tighten it up somewhat, maybe not to the degree you would prefer.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, Senator Moore, I think there will be an amendment offered that will even talk about parking lots. I mean I'm not sure your language is clear enough here to give us
