SENATOR HABERMAN: Would they be allowed in VFW, American Legion, Eagles, Elks, and all those places that do have a liquor license and do allow children to come in?

SENATOR MOORE: The amendment as written, yes, they would be allowed in those circumstances.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you, Senator Moore. Thank you, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Haberman. Senator Dierks, followed by Senators Chambers and Schimek. Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Madam President and members of the body, I guess that I am always amazed when I see the efforts that are brought forth to prevent this type legislation from passing, because we know that the legislation, in its original form, and the way that Senator Schimek intended for it, was one that would protect our citizens. And I guess I am always surprised and amazed, again, that our nation would subsidize an industry that poisons so many of our citizens every year. I am in complete support of Senator Schimek's bill, LB 130, and I am opposed to the amendment that Senator Moore brings, which I look on as a harassing amendment that must be brought on the part of the tobacco industry. And I have problems with that whole industry because of their attempts to poison our citizenry. So I would urge your not supporting this amendment of Senator Moore's. And I would urge that you support Senator Schimek's original bill without any more harassing, if possible. Thank you.
