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establishment having a liquor license. And I would add to that, if cigarettes or other tobacco products are dispensed from a vending machine to a minor in any establishment having such a license, such license shall be suspended for six months. A subsequent sale to minor from a vending machine shall result in the permanent revocation of such license. And the license refers to the liquor license that Senator Moore described in his part of the amendment. I...oh, is Senator Hefner gone? Senator Hefner, I'd like to ask you a question.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Hefner, oh Senator Hefner, I know you're on the premises. I'd like to ask you a question.

SENATOR HEFNER: Here I am.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Hefner, did you hear my amendment? If not, I'll state it briefly for you.

SENATOR HEFNER: No, Senator Chambers, I wasn't listening.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, well...

SENATOR HEFNER: Sorry about that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, put on your thinking cap and listen up. This amendment would amend Senator Moore's amendment. His amendment allows vending machines in restaurants. This amendment that I'm offering to his...

SENATOR HEFNER: No, Senator Chambers, I believe you're wrong there. It would be restaurants that had a liquor license.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, right. Okay, so I'm glad you specified it, you really are paying attention, and your thinking cap is on, and you're working. I stand corrected, and I appreciate that. Now here's what my amendment does. It would say that if cigarettes or tobacco products are dispensed from those vending machines in those restaurants, in those places having liquor licenses, that liquor license will be suspended for six months. A subsequent dispensing or sale from those vending machines to a minor will result in the permanent revocation of that liquor license. Do you support an amendment like this?
