It's just...if we talk about living will as has been pushed by Senator Landis, he says, let's allow people a choice, let's give people, if they want to do that, let's allow them do that. This living will legislation does allow the choice of the person and strips the choice from the physician, strips the moral right from the physician. I would urge that LB 2594 (sic) be adopted.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. We will now vote on the Lindsay amendment to LB 671. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the Lindsay amendment? Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Madam President, I'd ask for a call of the house, roll call vote.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a request for a call of the house? We'll have a machine vote. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. All unexcused senators please return to the chambers and record your presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Will the senators please check in and we will have a roll call vote. Looking for Senator Chambers, Senator Horgan, Senator Lowell Johnson, Senator Schellpeper, Senator Elmer, Senator Lamb, Senator Lynch, Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Morrissey, Senator Robak. Still looking for Senator Lamb. We're looking for Senators Lamb and Elmer. Senator Lindsay, we cannot locate Senator Lamb right now. Do you wish us to proceed or wait? Senator Lamb. Okay. We'll proceed with a roll call vote in reverse order.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote. See pages 572-73 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 20 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment fails. I will raise the call.

CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Lindsay. Senator, AM2574.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Lindsay.
