At a minimum we ought to see what Senator...at least make legislative history on this so that the courts will be able to interpret that, but let's at least see what Senator Landis's intent is by including this in the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. Before we proceed with debate I would like to call the senators' attention to the south balcony. We have special guests of Senator Schimek this morning, 50 additional members of the fourth grade class at Lakeview Elementary in Lincoln and their teacher. Would you please rise and be recognized. Welcome to the chambers. Thank you. I'll now recognize Senator Crosby followed by Senators Robak and Landis. Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Madam President and members, I'd like to say something before I ask a couple of questions of Senator Lindsay because I want to be sure I'm understanding what this amendment does. I think that we should thank Senator Lindsay and Senator Landis both for working together and bringing these amendments and trying to make this so you want a living will, I think everybody who wants that living will wants the statute to be the very best statute and have this bill written in the very best way so we don't have any problems with it when it kicks in and when it goes into effect. So I thank both of you and, Senator Lindsay, I feel that you're doing a really good service for me bringing these things because this bill is not the kind that we can just pass along in a hurried fashion. I don't think anybody wants to do that, so thank you. I want to understand quickly, you're taking out Section 9 altogether.

SENATOR LINDSAY: That's correct.

SENATOR CROSBY: And then you go on with the rest of those things are just to clean up the rest of it because Section 9 is gone? Is that what I'm getting? Okay, I just wanted to be sure that I understood all the rest of that. If you need some time, I don't have much more to say, would you like to go on with your questioning of lawyers?
