that if at some point in time we do decide to fund the development districts, we may do that, but it still provides for no funding under the present mechanism. It does talk about, in these new districts, it does talk about the money that each of the local governments puts into the fund. They do not want them using Community Development Block Grant Funds to pay their dues to these districts. They want them using tax dollars to do that so that there is more of a commitment on their part to be in these development districts. So those are the basic changes. It is a long amendment. I do realize that, but mostly it is just simply rearranging the order that the bill was in so that the bill flows more smoothly. I would be happy to answer any questions if there are any. Thank you, Madam President.
