consumption on the premises. After that was adopted, then the committee amendments were adopted to the bill, and the committee amendments provided that any place that was not accessible to the general public would also be exempted.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Mr. Clerk, is there anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Moore. (See FA249 on page 606 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Madam President and members, if you will recall the other day, as just described by Senator Schimek, the body adopted an amendment which I had introduced which broadened who would be allowed to still have vending machines, and the language of that amendment said, any establishment with a liquor license. This amendment, I believe, tightens that definition up. There was some concerns, an establishment, would that mean the parking lot or would that mean this amendment basically says on a licensed premises of an establishment with a liquor license. And when the Liquor Control Commission and the local government approves a liquor license, there is a description of the licensed premises. This...I wish I could say this would mean no hallways were included but I think there may be some situations where a hallway is included in the licensed premises. But, as I said, it does tighten up the definition in that amendment the other day, and I would ask for its adoption.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Moore. Does anyone wish to speak to the Moore amendment? Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Madam President, and members of the body, I am not going to oppose this amendment. I don't think it really takes care of the problem that we talked about the other day, as Senator Moore just explained, but it is not going to hurt either, so I don't oppose this amendment.
