SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the confirmation report as offered by Senator Nelson. Anyone wishing to discuss it? Seeing no one, do you wish to close, Senator Nelson? Waives closing. We will now vote on the confirmation report. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the confirmation report by the Retirement Committee. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the confirmation report as offered by the Retirement Committee.

SPEAKER BAACK: The confirmation report is adopted. We will now proceed to Select File. Senator Nelson.

SENATOR NELSON: We have one other, William Lindsay.

SPEAKER BAACK: They were both in the same report.

SENATOR NELSON: Should I give a little report on William Lindsay?

SPEAKER BAACK: Why don't you go ahead, but we have adopted the report. Go ahead.

SENATOR NELSON: Well, that's fine. William Lindsay is an attorney in Omaha, served...this will be his first appointment to the PERB board. His appointment also is a delegate at large for the State of Nebraska and his term expires in January of '97. He attended Creighton Law School and was an appointee for consideration to the appellate court in Omaha. And so this will be a new experience for Mr. Lindsay on the board. I think he comes very well qualified. I don't see Senator Lindsay on the floor this morning, but actually what I was going to say is that occasionally we all encounter some obstacle in life and we can't be accountable for our relatives, but since Senator Lindsay isn't on the floor this morning, he's very well qualified and I'm pleased to ask for his confirmation.
