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they have a family to feed, they have a job, so we'll change the sentencing.

SENATOR WARNER: One minute.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Some states take the license plates. I favor that. We don't know who has a driver's license and who doesn't. I support this issue. I support taking these people off the road for this reason. Those people that are killed have no chance for probation, they have no chance to have their sentence reduced or they don't have no chance to pay a fine, then serve time in jail. That is pretty serious. I'm very pleased and proud that I was the author of the first DWI bill. Too bad we didn't go this far then but I fully support what we're trying to do. I'll share my information with you from research when I do get it. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Peterson.

SENATOR PETERSON: Question.

SENATOR WARNER: The question has been called. Is there five hands? One...see five hands. Those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed nay. It requires 25 votes. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Peterson, for what purpose do you rise?
