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know, I find it real interesting that we have a state policy and we say, minors, you can't possess and drink alcohol. But it is okay if you have .09 blood alcohol in your stream and drive, that's okay. I mean, that is what the law is today. It is not all right for you to drink and use alcohol, but it is okay if you have alcohol and you've drank it and you drive. The policy isn't consistent, and then if you compound that and say, well, but in a college town everybody drinks anyway, so it shouldn't matter, I don't understand that policy either. If you go out to the University of Nebraska at Kearney and you are talking about students who are arrested for minor in possession, do you know what their penalty is? Two days in jail. Now that is a whole lot different than this. That is two days in jail whether it is your first offense or not of just having one beer. And so the penalty of revocation per se is a 90-day loss of license. What is more severe, two days in jail or the 90 days loss of license? I am just telling you that the state policy here is that it is wrong for minors not to have alcohol. Maybe we are wrong to have a 21-age drinking limit. Maybe that's the problem, but if you are going to have the policy that says, you are minors and you are not to have alcohol or use it, but it is okay if you have got it and you drink it and you drive, as long as you are under this limit, I find that totally at odds. It doesn't make any sense. That is the reason the committee put this amendment in there is to make it a consistent policy. Is it too harsh of a penalty? I don't think so. I think the administrative license revocation, you are talking here about the responsibility of driving, and, yeah, it may be a change from what they are doing now. But just because 20,000 students violate the law, I don't think that is true, I don't think they all do violate the law. That is the purpose for the amendment and the policy reason. Now, Senator Beutler, just so I am sure, your amendment...I haven't seen, did you pass your amendment out?

SENATOR BEUTLER: The amendment.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, the amendment is not passed out.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay, just so I can make...

SENATOR BEUTLER: All it does is...
