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Kristensen talks about me saying that prosecutors are lazy and dumb, he is the one who said that under the present law prosecutors can't make the jurors understand anything. Somehow the defense lawyers can make them understand the law, but because the prosecutors that he knows and that he has observed in action cannot win their cases, he wants us to enact a statute that will win it for them. Instead of presenting credible evidence that has enough weight to establish guilt, Senator Kristensen wants us to take away that responsibility from the prosecutor and say, now you presume that this equipment was accurate. What else is this other than a lazy prosecutor's provision? But the one we're talking about right now relates to an overly harsh punishment meted out to our young people. This bill is so bad in some respects and so perverse that the bad parts are of sufficient weight to pull down the rest of it that may have validity. I'm not in favor of these Draconian punishments and I don't feel that by taking a youngster's license is going to do anything other than subject that person...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to being charged with driving under a suspended license which carries a six-month jail term. So in addition to this heaping up of punishments, Senator Kristensen and I think everybody on this floor realizes that taking a young person's license is not going to stop him or her from driving. So what he is doing in his crafty way is making it possible to heap punishment upon punishment upon these young people and to make one act be the triggering event for a series of violations of the law. Why is there such a haste to convert our young people into criminals when they are not? Under the present law, if a youngster drinks alcohol with his or her parents at home and goes out with .02 in his or her blood, he or she is not a criminal. Senator Kristensen wants to create an entirely new class of criminals and that will raise the crime statistics, you can put more people in jail, people can argue about this judge not sentencing these young people to jail and all these criticisms that we hear...

SPEAKER BAACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...much of that comes because of ill advised legislation and this is one of the "illest" advised pieces of legislation that has come before us in a long time.
