SENATOR WESELY: Respiratory therapist.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Respiratory therapist, okay.

SENATOR WESELY: And then Robert Livingston who is an OD, that would be optometric.

SENATOR WESELY: Right, optometrist, and then Peter Whitted, who is an MD and I assume that that would be the ophthalmologist.
