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PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President, members. AM2671, as the Speaker said, or the Clerk rather, says on page 616 of the bill...616 in the Journal, and I have to refresh my memory. I apologize, I did not think we would be here this quickly.

CLERK: (Read amendment.)

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I believe that this is the amendment, as a matter of fact I'm sure that it's the amendment that deals with the ALR provision. And, again, this is the provision in the committee amendments would have the administrative license revocation, that procedure that would allow for an individual's license to be taken on the spot, basically a permit given for a 30 day period with regard to a drunk driving arrest. The ALR provision, as it would be amended with this proposal, AM2671, would have it subject to a second offense. So in other words you would strike the ALR provision as it relates to a first offense DWI. So those individuals who would be someone who would be looking at a first offense would, in essence, have the ability to go to court, remain...retain their license until the point in time when they were found to be guilty of driving while intoxicated. They would not have their license revoked on the...at the time that they were stopped, the time that they were arrested on first offense. On a subsequent or second offense, as stated in the amendment, those individuals would be subject to the ALR provision. What happens and what is the purpose behind 291 as offered through the committee amendments. I mean I would argue in the area of drunk driving what we should be doing is we should be moving toward dealing with those individuals who have a chronic problem, those individuals who are repeat offenders. And I think the statistics will bear out that individuals who cause many of these accidents...excuse me, Madam President, if I could just take a moment. Madam Chair, I have been misspeaking, it has been brought to my attention, and I appreciate that. This amendment is real similar to what Senator Beutler had, and I was working on a different amendment. So I would ask to respectfully ask unanimous consent to withdraw this one.
