SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Will. Anyone wishing to discuss the advancement of LB 1004? Seeing no one, we will now vote on the advancement. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the advancement of LB 1004, have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1004.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 1004 advances. We will now proceed to LB 906.

CLERK: LB 906, Mr. President, introduced by Senator Landis. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 8, referred to Health and Human Services, advanced to General File.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Dierks.

CLERK: I do have an amendment to the bill from Senator Dierks. (See AM2811 on page 730 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Dierks, are you handling the bill?

SENATOR DIERKS: No, I believe that Senator Wesely is.

SPEAKER BAACK: Oh, Senator Wesely, you are handling the bill?

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah.

SPEAKER BAACK: Okay, Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, LB 906 is a bill introduced by Senator Landis and was submitted for hearing to the Health and Human Services Committee where it was advanced unanimously, I believe. Yes. The hearing that we had outlined for us the background of the bill which is essentially that it comes from the Uniform Law Commissioners, which established this proposal in 1980. Some 30 states and the District of Columbia have approved it. It takes the next step in clarifying common law that needs to occur since the advent of the ability of heart and lung advancements
