SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That could be the final decision, and that's what I...

SENATOR WILL: It could be possible.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...I wondered where that was leading. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Anyone else wishing to address the advancement of LB 307? Seeing no one, Senator Will, do you wish to close? Waives closing. We will now vote on the advancement of LB 307. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the advancement of LB 307. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 307.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 307 advances. We'll now go to LB 746.

CLERK: LB 746, Mr. President, introduced by the Urban Affairs Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 23 of last year, referred to Urban Affairs Committee, advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending. (See AM0239 as found on Journal page 638, First Session, 1991.)

SPEAKER BAACK: The Chair of the Urban Affairs Committee, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, this bill, for one time we're going to cut down the amount of paper that we have in our statutes, because as we got looking at the issues dealing with the Metropolitan Utility District, as amendments were made and so forth, they were on different sections of the statutes. And so what we do with this bill, essentially, is to put it in one section. And so we have some amendments, which I will go through for the record, that we adopted in the committee after we worked very closely with Metropolitan Utility District, their staff, to draft this piece of legislation. First part of the amendment change, amends all reference to metropolitan cities to read cities of metropolitan class, that's the first change. Number two, in Section 22, page 25 inserts a reference to water, to permit MUD to adopt
