the floor a comprehensive bill containing the statewide pesticide management plan. And the bill, if adopted, would augment LB 349. The bill today we are considering would put into the law the who and the what and the where and how FIFRA would be enforced and administrated in Nebraska. And I think between now and next year LB 349 gives us time to...to work out some of these things, to have some statewide meetings. The sunset guarantees that we'll return with a plan next year and it will keep all the parties affected by this bill, the state, the fed, the applicators, farm groups, working together to try to come up with a plan. And, with that, I think, if I'm correct, now we were discussing an amendment by Chris Beutler. Senator Beutler, is this right?

CLERK: Senator, I have a note that Senator Beutler wishes to withdraw his AM2709. Is that your understanding? Is that consistent with your thinking, Senator?

SENATOR ROGERS: Yes, that's what he said.
