

SENATOR WARNER PRESIDING

SENATOR WARNER: The bill is passed. I'll take this opportunity to introduce a guest of Senator Pirsch. Constituency under the north balcony, Colleen Mayo, would you please stand so the Legislature could recognize you. Mr. Clerk, the...LB 291. Mr. Clerk, are there...anything on the desk?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President. LB 291 was the bill originally introduced by Senators Beyer, Rogers, Crosby, Hefner, Lowell Johnson, Byars, Schellpeper, Peterson, Wehrbein, Pirsch, and Warner. (Read title.) The bill was introduced last year, referred to the Transportation Committee. Mr. President, committee amendments have been offered and discussed as of February 4, and again on February 5. At that time, there were amendments to the committee amendments by Senator Beutler that were offered and adopted. When the Legislature was last discussing the bill, Mr. President, on February 6, Senator Hall had pending an amendment, AM2673. It's my understanding....

SENATOR WARNER: Before we recognize Senator Will, who will handle Senator Hall's amendment, I'd like to, on behalf of Senator Haberman, introduce Bill Fulcher from Sutherland, Nebraska seated under the north balcony, if he'd please stand and be recognized. In addition, there are a number of students from Creighton University Pharmacy, seated in the south balcony, Tom Dolan, Executive Director, in the south balcony. Would ask that those groups stand from Creighton University to be recognized by the Legislature. I now recognize Senator Will for the amendment that was offered by Senator Hall. Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Once again Senator Hall, until he gets here, has asked me to handle his amendments to LB 291. The amendment that we were discussing, AM2673, is the amendment that would relate to whether or not you could prohibit abstention from alcohol as a condition of probation. What I would do now is ask the body's indulgence to allow Speaker Baack to substitute an amendment that he has to the bill for this amendment. It's an amendment that I think is sort of a compromise amendment that Senator Hall knows about and has acquiesced to Speaker Baack's request to substitute. I would ask the indulgence of the body for that at this time.
