making some changes, making some adjustments in the bill, there is no doubt about that. I'm making some changes and lowering some limits, raising some. But I think we need to come to some reasonable kind of position on this issue before we're able to move forward on it. It still would leave in place one of the strongest drunk driving laws in the area and one of the strongest drunk driving laws in the country. So I think we are making progress, even if you adopt my amendment, we are making some progress towards that end. And, with that, I would be happy to answer any questions. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Abboud. Senator Abboud passes. Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Senator Baack, I, just for purposes of understanding the amendment before I talk about substance of it, I just want to make sure I know what this one does. You talked about if you plead guilty to the underlying criminal offense of DWI, then ALR would be suspended. And I...I'm trying to read through the amendment and find where in the amendment it does that. It...

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Kristensen, it's been brought to my attention that it does not do that correctly,...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay.

SPEAKER BAACK: ...and there does need to be a language change to do that. But my intention is to do that.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay, and I'll go...

SPEAKER BAACK: And we are working on that language, but it does not do that the way it presently reads. No.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay, 'cause we do need to do a little drafting change to do that. I understand your intention, that's the reason I wanted to talk about that. The other thing then it does do is it increases the penalties for third offense and creates the fourth offense but, at the same time, lowers from ten years to six years that period that you can get those in.

SPEAKER BAACK: That's absolutely correct.
