on it, you count those convictions for your entire lifetime. Some years...or some states do go to five years. We, in the committee, looked at that and decided that what we were trying to do was extend our current drunk driving laws and update them. And one of the problems with doing this is if you add a fourth offense, it's just practically very difficult to get four offenses in six years and to count the convictions. So on one hand it may look like substantively you're getting that fourth offense, but to be able to collect that in a six-year period of time is real difficult to do. The employment permits, Nebraska does not currently have driving permits while you're on probation, or while your license is revoked for employment purposes. That is a big point in the Nebraska law, quite frankly. When Senator Baack talks about that we have a stricter license, or a stricter law than other states, that is one point that we are...

SENATOR WARNER: One minute.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...stricter than other states is because we don't allow for those work permits. Now this is a policy choice here that he's proposing that would retreat on that, that would allow you a work permit after 30 days, if you use the interlock device. We haven't debated interlock a lot. Some people were uncomfortable with it, but it, in our amendment, in the committee amendment we put the interlock there, but it's after the hard period of time, after the normal 60 days of license revocation. The other part I think that you have to be careful with is if you are going to, after five years, allow someone to come back in and have their lifetime revocation removed, I mean, again that's another policy choice. The 15 years, if someone has been sober for five years, and goes...

SENATOR WARNER: Time.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...out and commits those offenses, I think you have to look at that...that policy real closely. Thank you.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Will.
