25 votes on drunk driving bills. And you come to a point where you have to weigh...weigh the decision on what's needed in the form of amendments that are being offered. Senator Baack's amendment isn't everything that I would like, but maybe it's a step towards getting some good pieces of legislation enacted into law. I have a question for Senator Baack, if he would yield.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Baack, yield? Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABOUD: Senator Baack, is this your intent, and by this particular amendment is this going to be the last amendment that you're going to be offering on this bill?

SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, this will be the only amendment that I'm going to offer on the bill. Well, I may have to offer another one to clear up the language that Senator Kristensen and I talked about, to clean up the language on the ALR, but...

SENATOR ABOUD: Well,...

SPEAKER BAACK: ...otherwise that's it.

SENATOR ABOUD: You know, it's my concern that Senator Hall has offered a large number of amendments on his bill. And from my...

SENATOR WARNER: One minute.

SENATOR ABOUD: ...my opinion, basically, just to badger the bill. And is this a good faith effort on your part to reach a compromise so that we can move on with this legislation?

SPEAKER BAACK: This is absolutely a good faith effort so that we can move on with this legislation. And I think that...I think that Senator Hall, you know I spoke to him yesterday, I think he will withdraw his other amendments to the bill, if this is attached.

SENATOR ABOUD: So it's your intent to move the legislation.

SPEAKER BAACK: That's exactly what the attempt is to do, yes.
