SENATOR WARNER: Anyone wish to take that? If not, it's passed over.

CLERK: I'm back to the Hall amendment that was passed over just a moment ago, Mr. President. Oh, I'm sorry, excuse me, that is not correct. This was passed over earlier. Senator, I have AM2672 in front of me.

SENATOR WARNER: Is there someone prepared to take the amendment? Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. President, I'd like to withdraw the Hall amendments and my amendment, please.

SENATOR WARNER: The amendments are withdrawn.

CLERK: Senator, does that apply to all of Senator Hall's then? Is that...do I understand?

SENATOR WILL: Yes.

CLERK: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR WARNER: They are withdrawn.

CLERK: Senator Bernard-Stevens has the next amendment, Mr. President. Senator, your AM2786. (Bernard-Stevens amendment appears on page 733 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. This...this amendment is an attempt, I think, to clarify some of the concerns that people had concerning the bill. I have not chatted with Senator Kristensen, I don't know if he would be supportive or not of the amendment. It's something I wanted to put forward to the body so at least we could make a decision one way or another on it. The concern that I have is one of the things that we're doing more often on laws that we pass, for very good reasons and intentions I think, is that we're being very harsh on punishments with reason. We want drunken drivers off the road. And we're tired of innocent people being hurt by drunken drivers, and we want to do something, and one of the things we can do is take licenses
