SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. President, I think the amendment is clear and has been discussed. Basically, it's a clarification amendment that simply verifies that the intent of the bill is not to add instructional hours nor to divert current instructional hours from other courses, but simply to integrate materials and teaching techniques. Would ask for the adoption of the amendment.
