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does, as it would be amended by the amendment that is presently before you, is simply saying that that water is subject to appropriation and I think we need to make it clear to DWR that that is the fact and somewhere in the bill that language has to be there, otherwise there is no bill. But it doesn't give the right to anybody other than a public water supplier. It doesn't...it is very limited as you can see.

SENATOR MOORE: Well I understand the bill is very limited and particularly the remainder of the bill is very limited and solves a specific purpose that I have no problem with. And you're right, I don't know exactly what it is Section 3 may do. As I mentioned on debate on another bill yesterday, I know you have some very strong convictions and specific ideas you want to go with water policy in the State of Nebraska. You and I may usually agree, sometimes we may not and obviously a concern that I have here is, why is those two sections in the bill if the rest of the bill solves the problem? You are of the opinion you need that. I guess maybe we need to discuss that more, I'm not so sure that we do, and I think we need to discuss that more on both now and if it moves along. Secondly, as I mentioned, I know there was a desire to try and...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR MOORE: ...to minimize, minimize, if not eliminate, the A bill on this particular measure, your amendment goes a long way towards doing that. I guess I...we still need, since the amendment was just filed yesterday, we still may need some time in relation to both Section 1 and Section 2, there are some costs there and we can discuss that further. So I'm not going to agree at this point in time. You've eliminated all need for an A bill, but you've certainly minimized it. So that's all I have, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. Senator Coordsen, you're next.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body, my question, my light was to ask Senator Beutler a question which he has addressed both in answer to Senator Wehrbein and Senator Moore with regard to what is meant by natural stream and in our search we found no legal definition although the term is used quite frequently throughout statute. The closest thing that we could come was a water course which is any depression or
