SENATOR PETERSON: What if I was to...what if I was to move, if the court doesn't overthrow 614, and I was to move down into the 21st District, I couldn't run because I hadn't lived there a year, right?

SENATOR COORDSEN: By my and other interpretation, yes.

SENATOR PETERSON: What...what...what prompted you to introduce this bill in the first place?

SENATOR COORDSEN: Last session, upon adjournment, I asked the question of several people as to when that bill became effective, and I was told that the effective date became...was 90 days after adjournment. In mid December I received a phone call raising the question of when, in fact, did the districts, the new districts, come into existence, because the bill says, shall become operative on January 6, 1993. The question is, is operative and effective the same thing or not?

SENATOR PETERSON: Okay, no further question. Senator Abboud, I'd like to ask you a question.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Abboud, would you respond, please.

SENATOR PETERSON: Senator Abboud, according to what I've heard that you had been the one that is requesting this bill. Why didn't you introduce it yourself?

SENATOR ABOUD: Well, actually I talked to Senator Coordsen about it and he wanted to introduce the bill.

SENATOR PETERSON: He wanted to introduce it. Why do you want to change...why do we have to do this so suddenly?

SENATOR ABOUD: Well, I feel it's a clarification of the law, if you'd like to ask Senator Coordsen that.

SENATOR PETERSON: Is it true that you want to move? But you're not up for election.

SENATOR ABOUD: No, I'm...I'm currently living in my district, Senator Peterson.
