designated and exactly how you know that they're covered in workmen's comp. So the language that you see in the amendment is that language and it's intended to be a mechanism so that we're sure that we know who these folks are and who...and how we're to extend the protection to them. So, with that, I just urge adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Just briefly. Senator Wickersham has found a way to better or further clarify what we intend to do with LB 28. It's a good amendment and I urge the body to support it.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Anyone else wishing to discuss the amendment by Senator Wickersham? Seeing no one, do you wish to close, Senator Wickersham? Waives closing. We will now vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Wickersham's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill?

ASSISTANT CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.
