SENATOR WILL: A newspaper of general circulation would be, I think, any newspaper that would be a general newspaper, and not a special trade-type paper, any daily or weekly, I would think.

SENATOR HALL: Okay, in Douglas County, does that mean that, for example, the World-Herald would be used as opposed to the Daily Record, or would the Daily Record be used as opposed to the World-Herald?

SENATOR WILL: In Douglas County, probably...I think, historically, the Daily Record has been interpreted as a newspaper of general circulation, although I am not sure that that's an accurate portrayal, but I think the Daily Record probably would be acceptable.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any other discussion on the amendment by Senator Will? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Will? Waives closing. We will now vote on the amendment by Senator Will. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the amendment by Senator Will, have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
